New alert system to help River Valley authorities

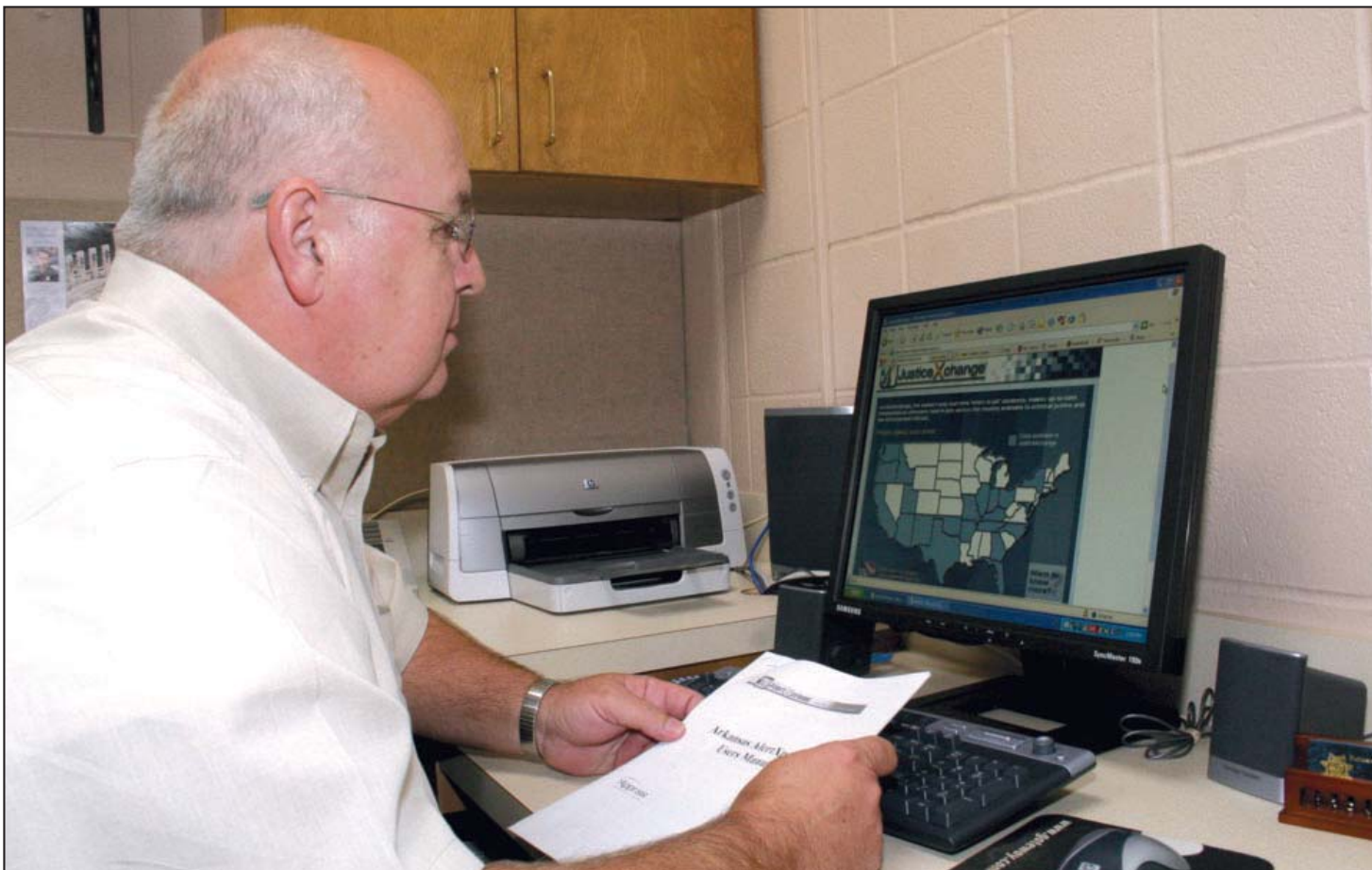

Notifying the public of an emergency is integral in seeing that the right duties are carried out and no one faces harm. A number of counties in the River Valley and Ozark area will be implementing a new alert system to assist with this task.

Alert Xpress is now being used in 39 counties. The rapid alert system, established about three years ago, spurred off the VINE (Victim Information and Notification Everyday) and Justice Xchange programs, currently being implemented by the Arkansas Crime Information Center (ACIC). All of the programs are offered free of charge to any authorities expressing interest.

The Justice Xchange program is an integrated justice application that gives law enforcement officials instant access to information about offenders held in jails across the country. Information from 34 states has been submitted for use in the program.

The VINE system consists of a network of computers placed in each county jail, prosecuting attorney's office, the Arkansas Department of Correction, the attorney general's office and the Post Prison Transfer Board, according to the ACIC Web site. The system

captures information on an offender's custody status.

Once victims have registered with VINE, they will be notified immediately by telephone or e-mail concerning any custody and/or court events that occur with the offender. The VINE system is capable of making thousands of phone calls at the same time.

It is with this technology that the Alert Xpress system is utilized, according to Susan Bradshaw, project manager for the programs at ACIC.

The Alert Xpress system "basically works the same" as the Emergency Broadcast System, "the only difference is who can control it," Bradshaw said. "This is all done on a local level."

Participants in the program can log onto the Justice Xchange Web site and proceed to the alert program. There, law enforcement officials can send any kind of message they would like to everyone in the city or county, or they can also choose to send a message to certain individuals or groups of people.

The message they choose is sent to Kentucky, where VINE is based, and based on its priority — emergency or non-emergency — is carried out to the recipients chosen by the local authorities. Those sending the message can choose how often the system calls each person. For example, for the VINE notification system, the system calls once each hour for 24

hours or until confirmation is received by the system that the targeted person has received the message.

The alert can be sent to phone, fax, e-mail or any device that receives text messages, such as cell phones, pagers and two-way devices.

Bradshaw said she has seen numerous different uses for the alert. "We had the Independence [County] Circuit Court use it last Friday," in which law enforcement officials sent out 211 phone calls at one time to alert people of past due fines and the consequences if they don't, she said.

A few uses for Alert Xpress exercised around the state and in Kentucky and Pennsylvania include the following:

- The Kentucky Department of Corrections uses the program to alert citizens if a prisoner escapes.
- The Kentucky State Police use the program to notify community residents if a sex offender moves into the area or to call victims of the sex offender to let them know if the offender has been released.
- Independence County law enforcement officials use the program to notify individuals of delinquent fines and to notify them of restitution. Their use of the program resulted in an immediate influx of pay-

City Council approves incentives to lure big employer

CONWAY — A sunnier day may soon be in sight for Conway's workforce.

Mayor Tab Townsell and the Conway City Council unanimously approved close to \$150,000 in incentives last Wednesday in attempts to lure a Fortune 500 employer, Jamie Gates, assistant to the mayor, confirmed.

Though no specific information about the company — name, where it's based, etc. — could be given, it is said the company, supposedly a call center, could employ 600 workers.

Meadows Office and Technology Park is one possible location for the prospective company, which has narrowed its choices down to Conway and two other unnamed Texas cities, Gates confirmed.

The call center would most likely open in the first quarter of next year. The biggest problem facing the city right now would be convincing the prospective company that Conway has the workforce to support the 600 positions.

"I think we could handle it," said Jan Spann of the Conway Area Chamber of

Commerce. Spann said Conway's inclusion in the search for this company gives evidence of the continued growth of the city. She also said the new company could benefit college students.

"It would certainly be a great business opportunity for students who could graduate and then stay in our community," and possible attract others from out of town,

she said.

Spann said everything is going well for the economy right now, and the new company could only help. She praised Conway Development Corp. for bringing in all types of new businesses to the area, as well as praising the Downtown Partnership for stimulating job growth in downtown business.

Other towns could most likely expect growth if the company chooses Conway, as well, Spann said. "Definitely," other towns like Morrilton, Greenbrier, Mayflower and even out to Clinton could see more people moving out and commuting in to Conway.

Gates confirmed that the state has also chosen to deliver an incentive package to the company.

The company is expected to make a decision within a month.

Out of a population of 43,167, Conway has 34,107 people in its work force (age 16 and older), according to information from the U.S. Census Bureau.

Out of its workforce, 2,185 are unemployed.

Faulkner County is the second fastest growing county in Arkansas at 43.3 percent, according to statistics.

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ments totaling over \$5,400 in two weeks.

• Officials in Sharp County use the program for recalling the search and rescue team and to issue flooding alerts for at-risk neighborhoods in the area.

• Arkansas State University Police use the program to issue weather advisories, maintenance notifications and campus safety alerts to all student dorms and campus housing.

Bradshaw said one advantage of this program is the localization of the alerts and its effectiveness. With the Emergency Broadcast System, many times advisories affecting one certain community or county are sent to neighboring counties. Basically, "it's not having to broadcast somebody else's message," Bradshaw said. Funding for the program will end this year, though.

The program has received money from a Cox technology grant, earmarked by Sen. Blanche Lincoln. The grant has been renewed for three years, with the last cycle being its last. "We know that this is the last amount of federal money that we're going to get," Bradshaw said.

She said ACIC plans to use some of the money from criminal records sales to help fund the \$400,000 needed to effectively run the Justice Xchange and Alert Xpress programs.

Arkansas is in a favorable position, she said. "We're the

cheapest state in the nation that uses any of these [programs] because we were the first state to [use them]."

The ACIC has been innovative in almost every aspect with its alert and information systems. Arkansas is the pilot state for many of the systems developed by an information technology company based in Louisville, Ky.

Arkansas was the first state to implement the VINE system, which is now being used in 39 states.

Thanks to the Justice Xchange program, which will work hand-in-hand with the alert program, authorized users in 34 states have the following capabilities:

• Offender lookup — Authorities are able to query the program for information regarding a current or historical offender;

• Booking detail — Authorities can view detailed information regarding a current or historical offender;

• Offender watch — Users can subscribe to be alerted if a certain person shows up in any jail in the program network;

• Photo lineup — Law enforcement officials can create a photo lineup from the archive of photos in the program's warehouse; and

• Incident reports — Authorities can review an offender's jail history and append notes regarding offender-related incidents.

"We've got close to 3,000 people signed up for Justice Xchange," Bradshaw said. ACIC's goal is to get those par-

ticipants to sign up for Alert Xpress. "The hard part is getting the word out about it because there's only two of us" that work with the programs, she said, relating to Stephanie Rector who works with Bradshaw in running the programs.

Faulkner County Sheriff Jack Pike said his office has begun preparations to use Alert Xpress. The office has already been trained on how to use it; however, he said the office has not implemented the program yet. "With the demo [that the office was shown] and what we realize it will do, we think it will be fantastic for alerting systems and emergencies," Pike said.

"And also being able to find people and make them aware that they may owe fines or fees before they get warrants issued. We think the system is going to work great."

Officials in Pope County began training for the program yesterday.

Any towns interested in using the alert program or Justice Xchange program "would just have to contact us" at the ACIC, Bradshaw said. All types of training are available. "We can walk them [new users] through it on the phone, there's manuals that they can go through," she said.

"It's free for them to use and we want them to use it now while we have the money to pay for it."
