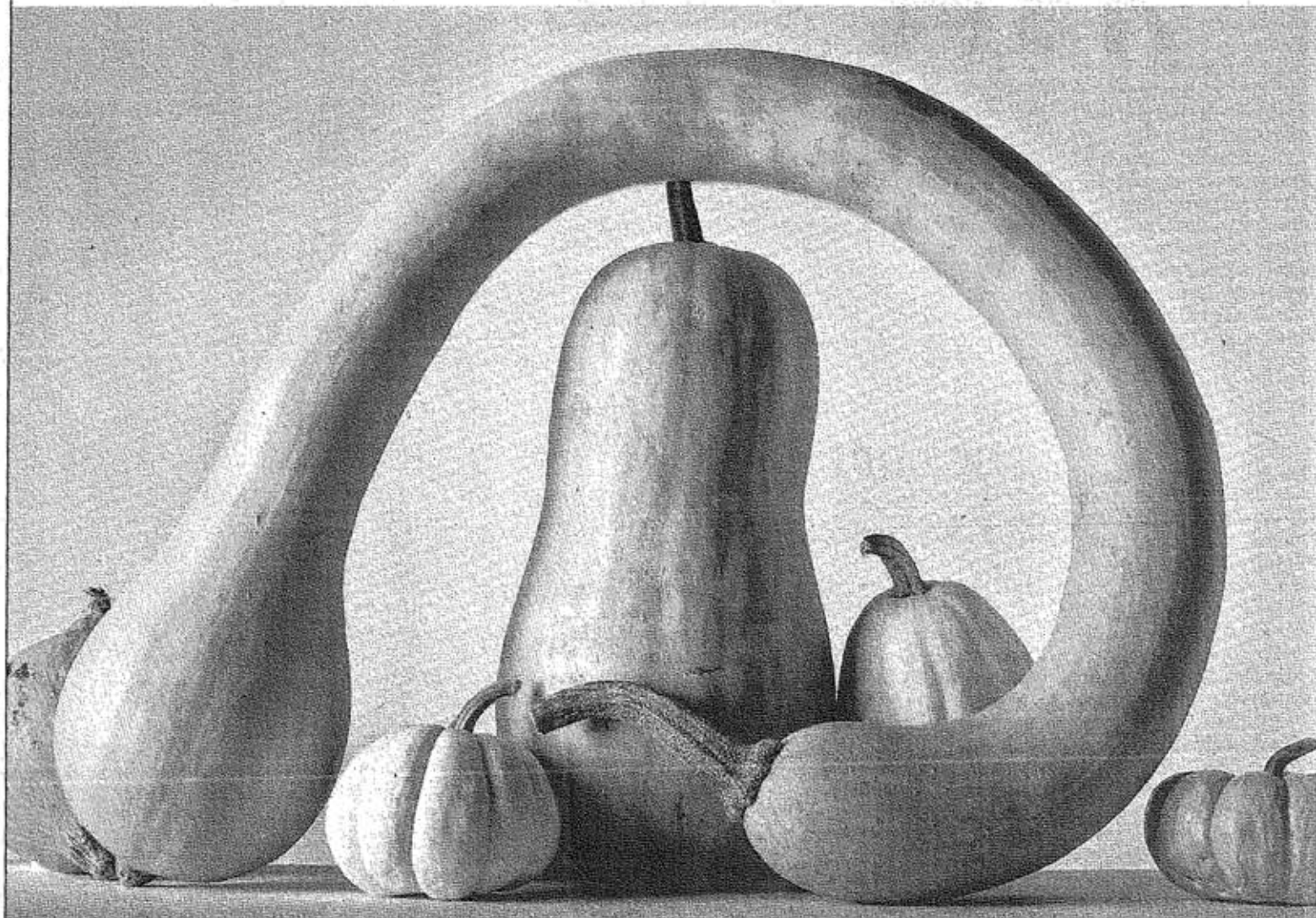

'SVU' spotlight

A crime-victim program created by a local company will be featured on a "Law & Order: Special Victims Unit" episode airing at 10 tonight on NBC.

VINE (Victim Information and Notification Everyday), a signature service by **Appriss Inc.**, allows crime victims to check on the status of their offender 24/7 and to register to be notified when the offender is released or has a change in custody status. The VINE program began in Louisville in 1994 in response to the 1993 murder of Mary Byron, who was shot to death on her 21st birthday by her ex-boyfriend, who had been released from jail without her knowledge.

In the 'SVU' episode, a female crime victim receives a call from VINE notifying her that her offender has been released.
