Appriss' JusticeXchange® data grows by 12 million in 2011
More than 66 million records available in secure data service

Law enforcement now has access to more than 66 million booking records in JusticeXchange, a 12 million increase over January 2011. JusticeXchange is an integrated justice solution that gives criminal justice leaders an instant, up-to-date database of booking records and other information from thousands of agencies across the country. The secure database also provides analytics, including the ability to map incident reports and view relationships, allowing users to analyze the data being presented.

“Over the past ten years, thousands of law enforcement agencies across the country have been able to locate missing persons, track registered sex offenders who have absconded, and find parents who have failed to maintain child support,” said Paul Colangelo, Appriss president. “Robbery, sexual assault, abduction and murder cases have been solved in part by the information JusticeXchange provides.”

In addition to the booking records, more than 12.6 million offender photos are accessible to participating agencies.

“More than 46 percent of individuals currently behind bars are wanted on other charges. In addition, one out of every 31 citizens in this country is under some form of correctional supervision,” added Colangelo. “JusticeXchange provides that link allowing law enforcement to connect the dots and move an investigation forward.”

Appriss launched JusticeXchange in 2002. Law enforcement agencies in nearly every state now use JusticeXchange to locate persons of interest in connection with their investigations. JusticeXchange also provides secure access to other information portals including NDEX (National Data Exchange), the Social Security Administration Death Master File, and several Department of Justice organizations: Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives; Federal Bureau

of Prisons; Drug Enforcement Administration; Federal Bureau of Investigation; and the United States Marshals Service.
