One of the most significant challenges facing communities across America is the illegal manufacture of methamphetamine (meth). Those responsible for this crime are able to “cook” the drug with minimal room, equipment, or knowledge. A major component of any meth operation is a steady flow of pseudoephedrine (PSE), often found in over the counter cold medicines.

Federal and, in most cases, state legislation requires PSE products to be placed behind the pharmacy counter. Purchasers must provide identification and sign a log each time they purchase. These logs are subject to review by law enforcement personnel for the purpose of enforcing legislative requirements.


The Problem
